Tense	Active	Passive
Present simple	Anna offers a prize to the student.	The student is offered a prize.
Present progressive	Mu mum is cooking spaghetti right now.	Spaghetti is being cooked right now.
Present perfect	They have sent an email to the committee.	An email has been sent to the committee.
Simple past	The boy broke car window.	The car window was broken .
Simple future	The writer will publish a new book.	A new book will be published .
Modals	He should read the new study first.	The new study should be read first.

Example:

A.G. Bell **invented** the telephone in 1876. → The telephone **was invented** in 1876 by A.G. Bell.
(Simple past) (Active) *(Be (past) + past participle) (Passive)*
